The Hotel RL (Red Lion) offers guests a 10-seat van that travels within a four mile radius. **Sunday**, the shuttle is available for transport to/from the SPSCC. **Monday**, the hotel shuttle runs to the Capitol every hour. Make required reservations at the front desk for each day.

Dash Shuttle

Olympia Intercity Transit Dash shuttle serves downtown Olympia, operating every 12 min. from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., every 15 min. from 7:00 to 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 to 6:00 p.m.

Downtown Olympia Parking

Hourly parking (\$1.50/hour) available at the locations below and at meters throughout downtown Olympia and vicinity. Have change available, although some meters take credit/debit cards. Pay at the meter located at each lot:

Farmer's Market: North end of Capitol Way. Park in the green-striped stalls.

Visitor Parking at Maple Park: Maple Park Avenue & Jefferson Street. From I-5, take a left at the Jefferson roundabout and then a right onto Maple Park Avenue. The lot is immediately on your right.

Professional Arts Lot: 11th Avenue & Washington Street.

Note: All day parking is available at the Governor Hotel for \$5.00 a day. Park there and take the DASH up the hill to the Capitol.

Parking at the Capitol: Parking is limited at the Capitol. Lots near the Legislative buildings require payment (\$1.50/hour). Street parking on the N. Diagonal and S. Diagonal is convenient for early-arrivers. See map page 26.
